

## Get your Junior ready for college!

Now that your student is back in the swing of school, it's time to start planning for college. Part of planning for college includes taking important tests like the PSAT and SAT. In the classroom, the Junior Grammar Program at SGCS applies grammar in the SAT format, both in reading and sentence reconstruction. Students also continue to work on composition three days a week. There are other ways to prepare for these tests outside of school that are very helpful as well. Here are a few key things that your student should be doing during their Junior year.

### Take the PSAT/NMSQT

Take advantage of the PSAT (Pre Student Aptitude Test). Not only will this test give you an idea of what it is like to take the SAT, you will also be able to identify areas that you might need to brush up on to get the best score on your SAT. Remember that it is only a "practice" test and does not count against you.

Surrey Garden Christian School is an official testing site for the PSAT/NMSQT, which will be on **Saturday, Oct. 18 from 8 – 10:30 a.m. in the Cafeteria**. The cost \$13. The registration form is on the SGCS web site under the "For Students" tab under "College Prep." **The deadline to sign up is Monday, Sept. 22.**

### SGCS Juniors benefit from taking Mock SAT

Students can sign up for a free Mock SAT sponsored by The Princeton Review at the Southeast Regional Library in Gilbert. Students take a full-length mock SAT and receive a detailed analysis on their performance, pinpointing their individual strengths and weaknesses. Once you have taken a few practice tests, it is time to take the SAT. A good time to take this test for the first time is in the winter of your Junior year. If your scores are not where you want or need them to be or do not meet the requirement for the college of your choice, you can always take it again in the spring.
